



Community Call to Action: Pause Wastewater Pipeline Construction at Festival Beach Food Forest

How to Contact Your City Council Representative

Festival Beach Food Forest is asking for an immediate pause on planned wastewater pipeline construction to allow for a permaculture-based approach to this utility project and the impacted area. One of the most effective ways to support this request is to contact your City Council representative directly. Festival Beach Food Forest is located in [District 3](#), so messages from District 3 residents are especially impactful.

Step 1: Find Your City Council District

Before emailing your representative, confirm which City Council district you live in.
